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WELCOME TO DOVER SHERBORN ACADEMY



Dover Sherborn Academy (DSA) is a town-exclusive soccer development program built on a shared mission: to provide high-quality, age-appropriate training that supports long-term player development, strengthens community culture, and elevates the standard of Dover Sherborn soccer from the earliest ages through high school.

DSA is a collaboration between Next Step Training and the Dover Sherborn Soccer Club, with full support from the DSSC Board and Dover Sherborn High School coaching staff. Our program is uniquely designed to align with the town's values, offering consistent technical instruction, small-sided game experience, and mentorship in a structured and supportive environment.

What sets DSA apart is its commitment to community-rooted player development. The goal is not just to build better soccer players — it's to create a development funnel that leads directly into the Dover Sherborn High School program while also building strong team identities and player camaraderie from an early age.



THE ORIGIN STORY

Dover Sherborn Academy began as an idea from Evren Gunduz, the Dover Sherborn Girls Varsity Soccer Head Coach. In late 2024, Evren reached out to Next Step Training with a vision: to create a player development pathway that would raise the overall quality of high school soccer while keeping the town's youth engaged in their community.

Evren expressed concern over how many players were being pulled in different directions by club soccer commitments — often at the expense of their town teams and teammates. He believed in creating something better, local, and long-term focused — a program that not only competed at a high level but was also built around the DSSC calendar and values.

Through his leadership and the support of the DSSC Board, that vision became a reality. Dover Sherborn Academy is now positioned to reshape the future of soccer in the town — uniting families, players, and coaches under one clear, elevated direction.

WHAT MAKES US DIFFERENT



Dover Sherborn Academy is not just another club team — it's a community-first development model that aligns technical training, team culture, and town spirit under one umbrella. DSA is built from the ground up with three core goals in mind:

Where many club programs can pull players away from their community, DSA is designed to do the opposite — develop players without pulling them out of Dover Sherborn.

TOWN-ALIGNED CALENDAR

All training sessions, games, and tournaments are scheduled around the DSSC and school calendars. This ensures players can participate fully without choosing between town and club.

COACHING QUALITY & MENTORSHIP

Every team is led by a trained Next Step head coach, supported by Dover Sherborn high school varsity players and local volunteers. This unique structure ensures consistency, mentorship, and leadership development.




LUIS SILVA

OUR COACHING PHILOSOPHY

At DSA, we believe great coaching goes beyond the whistle. Our staff is committed to developing skilled, confident, and thoughtful players through purposeful, high-quality training. Every session emphasizes individual growth, team understanding, and a love for the game—building not just better athletes, but better people.



PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Dover Sherborn Academy is designed to complement the existing town soccer infrastructure by offering a structured, high-quality club experience that prioritizes player development, community cohesion, and school pride. Teams will be organized based on grade to maintain consistency with town soccer. Our model blends professional coaching, town soccer participation, and competitive league play to create an enriching and balanced experience.

TEAM STRUCTURE & AGE BREAKDOWN

- We are targeting 4–8 teams in Year 1, from Grade 3 through Grade 8.
- Each team will be made up of grade-based cohorts, rather than birth years, to align with Dover Sherborn's school system and long-term varsity goals.
- Teams will compete in the New England Club Soccer League (NECSL), offering consistent competition and flexible scheduling.

PRACTICE & GAME MODEL

Each player will benefit from multiple training touchpoints and competitive games:

- 1 Town Practice (DSSC team)
- 1 Town DOC Practice (skills-focused, mixed group)
- 1 DSA Team Practice (club-specific)
- 1 DSSC Game (BAYS league)
- 1 DSA Game (NECSL match)

Out-of-season, players will continue with 1x/week DSA training and optional clinics or futsal.

To further enrich the player experience, DSA will explore participation in the following events:

GRADES 1–2 SKILLS CLINICS

Designed for our youngest players, this clinic builds a strong technical foundation and a love for the game.

- Focus on dribbling, passing, and shooting fundamentals
- High-rep, fun, and engaging skill-based games
- Led by Academy coaching staff with support from high school mentors
- Conveniently held after school





GETTING INVOLVED

1. VOLUNTEER ROLES FOR PARENTS

Parents play an essential role in the overall experience of our student-athletes. Each team will include one designated parent volunteer who works closely with the coaching staff. In addition to that key role, here are other ways parents can contribute:

TEAM PARENT VOLUNTEER (1-2 PER TEAM)

Assists with sideline coordination, snack schedules, communication, and supports the head coach with basic logistics.

EVENT CREW

Help set up or support tournaments, team gatherings, photo days, and other special events.

FUNDRAISING ASSISTANTS

Participate in organizing fundraising opportunities such as raffles, gear drives, or local restaurant nights.

UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT HELPERS

Support with inventory, distribution, or returns for team uniforms and gear.

COMMUNITY AMBASSADORS

Spread the word about DSA within your circles—especially helpful during registration periods.

2. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

We love seeing older players give back and inspire the next generation. While we are prioritizing parent volunteers this year, high school students may still contribute in the following ways:

CAMP HELPERS

Assist during summer/winter clinics or DSA-hosted camps with logistics, registration, or equipment.

EARN COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

DSA can provide official documentation for community service hours for school or college requirements.

MENTORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Pending availability, selected students may be invited to observe DOC-led sessions or assist in a limited support capacity (non-coaching roles).

UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

Every player enrolled in Dover Sherborn Academy will receive a complete uniform package as part of their tuition—no additional purchase necessary. We believe in outfitting our players with high-quality gear that represents both pride and professionalism on and off the field.

INCLUDED IN EVERY PLAYER KIT

Parents play an essential role in the overall experience of our student-athletes. Each team will include one designated parent volunteer who works closely with the coaching staff. In addition to that key role, here are other ways parents can contribute:

HOME KIT (JERSEY, SHORTS, SOCKS)

A coordinated away set to avoid uniform clashes during league and tournament play.

To be worn at all DSA training sessions for a consistent and professional training environment.

Uniform distribution will occur prior to the Fall season launch. Players are expected to wear the correct gear for every session and match, contributing to a unified, high-level training culture.

TUITION & REGISTRATION



Dover Sherborn Academy's tuition for the 2026-2027 season is **\$1,850 per player**. This comprehensive fee reflects our commitment to delivering a high-quality, development-focused soccer experience that is both affordable and enriching for families in the Dover Sherborn community.

HOW TO JOIN

We're excited to launch Dover Sherborn Academy for Fall 2026 and invite families to be part of this player-centered, town-aligned soccer experience.

STEP 1

SUBMIT THE INTEREST FORM

To begin the process, families will complete a short online Interest Form indicating their child's name, birth year, and general availability. This is not a formal registration—just a way for us to gauge interest, organize rosters, and communicate next steps. Once enough interest is confirmed in a specific age group, we'll reach out directly to those families.

STEP 2

ATTEND INFO SESSIONS (OPTIONAL)

In early 2026, we will host an **in-person family info session** where you can meet our team, ask questions, and learn more about our schedule, training model, and player development approach.

STEP 3

OFFICIAL REGISTRATION OPENS

After finalizing rosters and confirming sufficient interest in each age group, we'll open formal registration. At that time, we will collect full tuition and uniform sizing information.

WHAT IF THERE AREN'T ENOUGH PLAYERS?

We understand some families are evaluating other club options and are concerned about committing early. Rest assured—we're starting with an **interest form only**, not payment or full registration.

If we find there aren't enough players in a certain group to field a team, we will **communicate early** so your family can make other plans without missing out on club opportunities. We will never leave you without a clear path forward. That said, we're already seeing strong momentum across multiple grades and expect full rosters at most age groups.
